## OPERATIC MUSIC RETURNS TO THE AIRWAVES

WJFF is happy to bring vocal music, including opera, choral music and songs to the airwaves with a new program, *Classics for Voice*, hosted by Heinrich Strauch and heard Sunday nights from 10pm on.

A number of years have passed since vocal music such as this has been heard on a regular basis on the WJFF airwaves. The Program Committee was thrilled to receive a program proposal from volunteer Heinrich Strauch, who has been involved with the station for the last year. Heinrich's show features the whole spectrum of vocal music from full operas to features on composers, singers, voice types and musical styles.

Heinrich grew up with a lot of Choral and Symphonic music, but Opera and Song are a much newer interest. He currently serves on the Board of Directors for the Delaware Valley Opera and enjoys the opportunity *Classics for Voice* gives him to explore and research the repertoire and be exposed to new territories.

A native of Germany, Heinrich moved to the US in 1996, and has been a resident of Sullivan County

since 2000, first as a weekender but now full-time. While he is not a singer himself, he is in awe of the ability of great singers to translate human emotions into beautiful sounds. "The more I listen, the more it seems to me that the voice is the best instrument there is."

## WJFF Back on Time-Warner Cable

Our thanks to Time Warner Cable who has reinstated the FM cable-radio service and included WJFF on its restricted lineup of 10 stations. Time Warner had discontinued fm radio service to their subscribers in the fall of 2003 to make room for more TV stations. Due, in part, to the enormous response from listeners left in the lurch, they are bringing the cable radio service back, though on a smaller scale. In order to receive WJFF (and nine other fm stations) on your cable, a digital cable box is required.

This reinstated service is good news for many people in the valleys, and far reaches of our listening area that could not receive WJFF any other way. If you know friends and family who have trouble hearing us on our 90.5fm and 94.5fm frequencies, please tell them about this service. 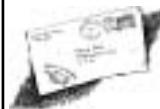
